# WHY PREVENTION

- ◆ Billions of dollars are lost annually as a result of construction theft and vandalism .
- ◆ Hand and power tools, material, generators, heavy equipment, radios, telephones and computers are stolen daily from jobsites.
- ◆ Stolen compressors and small tractors are often used in illegal activities.
- ◆ Stolen items are being sold back to unsuspecting contractors.
- ◆ Replacement costs, short term rental costs and wasted labor costs directly affect productivity and profit.
- ◆ As little as 10% of stolen equipment is recovered.
- ◆ State budget issues are resulting in a reduction of law enforcement, suspects not being booked in jails and courts delaying trials.
- ◆ Prevention protects the profit margin.
